# TTBOC CHAMP SHOW JUDGES CRITIQUE

My sincere thanks to the Officers and Committee of TTBOC for this opportunity to judge this lovely breed again at a very well organised show with a very pleasant atmosphere. Also, my sincere thanks to my 2 efficient stewards who worked tirelessly throughout the day. Originally, I was supposed to judge the 2023 show, but was asked to officiate this year, as the judge elect was unable to attend due to Covid restrictions and being based outside the UK. In one way I was not looking forward to this appointment so soon after my last, as it was not within my own self-imposed time interval, (albeit within a few months) of 3 years. For my last TT appointment, I had written some very strong comments about a large number of exhibits which I felt had wandered far from the breed standard, and was of the opinion that in retrospect I should have withheld on them, and would do so in the future. As it happens, I should not have worried at all because there was not one of the 'looks a bit like it may have been related to a TT' exhibits present today, in what was a very decent numerical entry, especially in the current climate. The watch words for this breed, for me at least, are "without exaggeration" and today to use the cliché 'what I got, was what it says on the tin'. Needless to say, I was delighted.

There are a couple of deficits I feel are worth making breeders/exhibitors aware.

There are a couple of deficits I feel are worth making breeders/exhibitors aware of, and would not like to see them creep in as the norm. The Breed Standard asks for "Marked stop, but not exaggerated" however some were a shade shallow for want of a better word. If this continues as a trend it would eventually alter the shape of the head altogether. The other was that there were some bites which were neither Scissor or Reverse scissor, more erring towards level.

Overall, the depth of quality in the bitches far better than I found in the dogs. The Limit Bitch class was an absolute delight. Despite being under cover with doors and windows opened, it was a very hot day and a number of exhibits underperformed. Another factor which played its part was that puppies and juniors, and even some of the yearlings, had not had the opportunity to have ring craft and socialisation training that they would have done had we not been living in uncertain times. Given time, and with the TT attitude to life, I am hopeful they will catch up with the more experience they get.

Veteran D 6 Ent/1 Abs 1<sup>st</sup> Kipukyi Hot Ripper for Jalren

Good size and pleasing outline, nothing about him overdone. Solid top line, good shoulders and complimentary rear angulation, decent reach at the front and drive at the rear. Would have preferred him to carry a shade more weight, but overall, he is a very decent representation of the breed. Happy disposition.

2nd Int/Lux/Be Ch Layoli Hot N'Smoking

One I have seen before, very similar comments as applied to the winner and therefore ran close in the decision-making process. Well balanced head, has a slightly more defined stop than the winner, however is a shade longer in the body. Lovely large feet and still moving well.

3rd Kybo Loony Tunes

Quite raw but slightly more coordinated on the move than class mate. Pleasing make and shape, nice head but naturally need more development which should

come with age, decent underjaw, good neck, well laid shoulders and had good rear angulation but doesn't have the full coordination to use it with the rear at the moment. Good depth to chest, keeps his top line better on the floor than he does on the table. Overall, quite a promising youngster. BPD

2nd Kelsmorespitz Golden Storm

Equally raw as the winner was, was slightly better developed in the head, good muzzle to skull balance, decent neck and shoulders, well ribbed back and top line far better on the move than the in the stack or table. His main issue is although he has good rear angulation, he has no idea how to use it and tend to tuck it forward and therefore makes him look bum high. On the move he tends to push too hard and this make him look very untidy going away, handler need to get this under control to get the best out of him. Nonetheless he shows promise.

Little to choose between these two, but he was far more coordinated on the move.

Overall has a decent make and shape, head not yet finished need to broaden slightly in the skull, I'm guessing he is going to be a slow developer. Reasonable ribbing decent enough shoulders kept his top line on the move and standing, coat beginning to blow slightly, but has promise as he heads towards adulthood.

2nd Dhoki Apsos No Doubt I'm Hot (imp Nor)

If I take all the points on this one, he has the makings of an excellent prospect for the future, but the problem is at the moment, nothing comes quite together. Pleasing enough shape, good head and neck, lovely shoulders, super rear angulation, so much to like about him, but no real coordination. I think maybe had he been on grass where he could dig in, I think I would have seen a far better representation of him on the move. He is one to watch for the future, but sadly not his day today not his day today

Yearling D 3 Ent/2 Abs

One could be forgiven for thinking that this one and 2<sup>nd</sup> in the last class were litter brothers, as when it come to make and shape, they match perfectly, but the difference was that this boy most definitely had his act together 100%. Lovely well-balanced head, good underjaw, strong neck, well laid shoulders top line absolutely perfect, and the rear angulation superb, and when it came to his movement, foot perfect all the way, makes it look effortless. Beautiful presentation. More than happy to award him the RDCC

Decent overall shape to body, needs more muscle to keep everything in place on the move, coat coming on nicely, just needs time to finish. His head is his crowing glory at the moment, body needs to mature to catch up to it, needs more muscle to help the use of his shoulders and rear, the angulation on both is adequate and a good spring of rib. He tended to be a bit naughty on the move, but changing the side he was walking on improved things dramatically. For me a bit of a slow developer but time should do him some favours in the future.

Lovely balance to his head, very clearly defined stop but without exaggeration, strong neck, good muscle throughout, well balanced body, square, with lovely angles fore and aft. Lovely spring of rib, top line solid at all times. He moved so easily which made it a pleasure to watch. Still quite young for my taste but I could not deny him that which he richly deserved, DCC. Unfortunately, the change of handlers for the BOB did him no favours so he finished as BOS in Show.

2nd Talisman Tibeta Budda (imp Bus)

Interesting dog that on first glance did not appeal, however the examination tells a very different story. Pleases in the head with lovely expression, very dark eyes, great pigmentation and good head carriage carried on a strong neck. Although he is just over 4 years old, he needs to fill out more and cover the very pleasant frame he has, reminiscent of the breed back in the day when I came into it, and a TT was not considered mature until it was past its 4<sup>th</sup> birthday. We may not have seen the best of him yet.

Veteran B 8 Ent/1Abs

As the saying goes, she took my eye from the moment she entered the ring, and my heart too. Stunning head and expression, beautiful outline, such symmetry is seldom seen in my humble opinion, everything was as it was supposed to be. In the challenge I came down to one small point which I feel is solely down to personal preference and not considered a fault. I was more than happy to award her RBCC, RBIS and Best Vet in Show. Hope she gets her crown soon; she is a very worthy of a GB title.

Typical movement, however, for me, she is rather pushing the acceptable height for a bitch.

Overall, she is well proportioned in both head and body, good tail set, a shade soft in the muscle which did not help her front movement. Beautiful coat and put down to perfection.
